They hid behind laws created in the name of religion to serve themselves and their desire for power, Jesus overturns the tables of their selfjustifications. He quotes the prophet as an accusation: "This people honors me with their lips, but

their hearts are far from me" (Mark 7:6).

Before pointing an accusatory finger, realize that the same can happen to us. We can cling to human traditions and laws while disregarding God's basic

commands of love and mercy. We can hide

behind those laws and traditions to justify our self-righteousness and look down on others who are not as pious as us, as noted by James:

"Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves."

effort to remind the Church, especially the clergy, of this truth: "Dangerous as it was then for the Pharisees, so too is it for us to consider ourselves acceptable or, even worse, better than others simply for observing the

rules...even though we do not love our neighbor, we are hard of heart, we are arrogant and proud."

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR FRANCISCAN WORKS- LIBERIA MISSION

Franciscan Works currently operates Liberia Mission in West Africa. Founded in 2003, just as the Liberian civil war was ending, Liberia Mission began with six orphaned children. Today it is a vibrant, life-saving community of love, learning, work and prayer, with about 35 residents. Nearly 500 youths from surrounding villages attend St. Anthony of Padua Mission School or are funded to attend local High Schools. These are young people who would not otherwise have access to education, medical care, adequate food and shelter, and faith-formation. St. Michael the Archangel Church, located on the Mission, serves the school and community. A student-run farm and piggery are part of the vocational education the students receive. These children are learning to become future leaders in their families, communities and country. Much prayer, joy and hope is evident at Liberia Mission, even with the sorrow and hardships associated with the 2014-15 Ebola outbreak and the political and economic strife there. 

PLEASE JOIN US FOR AN AFTERNOON BIBLE STUDY!

Starting at 1:00 P.M. on **Wednesday, September 12**th and continuing each week until October 31st in Bergan Hall, members of the Adult Faith Formation Team will facilitate an eight week session, *Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible.* With the history of salvation as its theme, this study tells how God has never abandoned us despite our many failings. Beginning with creation and man's first sin, we read about Noah, David, and so many other familiar stories - all culminating in Christ's death, resurrection and new life through the Church. In addition to God's plan for our salvation, this study is particularly helpful to anyone who may have found the Bible a little confusing and frustrating to read. By focusing on the narrative books, it becomes easier to understand how all the books are interconnected. Each week, participants will view a 30 minute video followed with a discussion on the recommended readings. The video is narrated by Jeff Cavins, who is a primary author of the series and frequent guest on the Catholic Network. Though participants will use their own Bibles, we are suggesting that they purchase *The Bible Timeline (\$5.00)* which complements the program and will be a helpful guide for future Bible reading and study.
