

This marble statue by the baroque sculptor Gian Lorenzo Bernini commemorates the life of Pope Alexander VII. It sits above the *porta della pregliiera*—the side door of St. Peter's Basilica—and it shows the Pope kneeling in prayer. The Pope was known to prayerfully reflect on his death, and supported many beautification projects in Rome.

Civil or religious authority should be a service. Public authority is conferred upon a person by election or

appointment in order to promote the common good. Far from a career of self-aggrandizement, it's a call to place the good of others before one's own.

When speaking of this, Jesus places the emphasis on trustworthiness. Those delegated authority are there to serve and to honor the confidence given them. And when trust is lost in public life and personal relationships, life becomes a walk through a valley of fear where we are governed by self-preservation. Truly then, we become what the Latins wrote: "Man is a wolf to man."

So be worthy of the trust your family, clients, and others place in you. Be worthy of the confidence God has bestowed with all the talents he has given to use for the good of others. Make your life a responsible gift to others and rejoice in their flourishing more than your own!

# St. Agnes - September Saint of the Month

Although Saint Agnes was born at the end of the third century, her story is relevant in these times when predatory sexual behavior is in the headlines and women are fighting to be treated with dignity and respect. Agnes was born into a wealthy and prominent Roman family and she was a beautiful young girl. Many men wanted to marry her. But Agnes chose to devote herself to Christ and be chaste, flying in the face of the patriarchal customs of the time. After a significant struggle, Agnes was given the choice to marry or be sent as a slave to a house of prostitution. In the ensuing struggle Agnes was stabbed and died at the age of twelve. This brave young woman was regarded as saintly soon after her death. She symbolizes the ongoing struggle of people to have the right to say no and make their own life decisions. Her feast day is January 21st and she is the patroness of youth, chastity and rape victims. To find her window, stand at the back of the church facing the altar and look left. Perhaps we should be cognizant of the fact that traditionally the followers of Jesus valued the right to say no and to choose ones calling and beliefs. We could pray to Saint Agnes to awaken powerful people to this truth.



## **GUIDELINES FOR THE MASS INTENTION BOOK**

The book of Mass Intentions for St. Ignatius Loyola Parish will open for 2020 on Wednesday, October 9th. We respectfully ask that your requests be for death anniversary Masses (4 Masses per year per family). We are required by Canon Law #953 that the parish may accept only the number of Masses that can be fulfilled within a year. Therefore, we will only accept requests for the daily Masses (7:30 a.m. Monday – Saturday and 12:10 PM Monday – Friday). We will also be eliminating the 7 day and Month's Mind Masses to enable us to fulfill the requests made when the book is opened. The weekend Masses are reserved for Masses that must be fulfilled including one Mass each weekend for the People of the Parish.

Also, please know that due to the number of Masses presently on record the parish will no longer be able to accept Mass intentions from an individual's estate (you may wish to consider a trust fund which can be established to distribute a certain amount each year to fulfill your requests. This would be handled by your estate planner, no more than 4 Masses per year can be accepted).

We would ask that you contact the rectory regarding a Mass intention directly and not make the request at the funeral home. Again, we are required to only accept the Mass intentions that can be fulfilled within the year. Your understanding as well as your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Please call Jen at 570-288-6446 to schedule the Masses.


